

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Welcome to Marblehead Little Theatre's production of *Gypsy!* Regarded by many musical theater scholars to be the best work of musical theater ever written, *Gypsy* is the perfect work for the return of our summer musicals to the stage after a three year hiatus. In the summer of 2009, the June musical theater slot in MLT's season created an opportunity for youth, college students, and adults to share the stage in the rigorous process of mounting a show in just a few weeks. *Gypsy* affords the opportunity for a multigenerational staff and cast to collaborate, create, and execute a large-scale production in our intimate black box space.

The idea of reworking a traditionally epic work is a challenge long embraced by our creative team and staff. I first imagined *Gypsy* in MLT's blackbox space as a bare bones production, creating a space that allows the audience to focus keenly on relationships, the backbone of the story. The idea of creating a trunk show, a theatrical tradition created for very small theatrical performances where the only props and costumes for the event are contained within a single trunk, sparked my vision for this production. Rose is always uprooting her family. They constantly travel to find the next gig in search of the "big break." Using suitcases, trunks, and placing an emphasis on travel, our design team will take you on a journey, immersing you in the day to day life of Rose, her daughters, and everyone she encounters along the way.

Finally, we would like to acknowledge the use of the word "Gypsy." The word's origins include reference to a member of a people originating from South Asia who have traditionally practiced an itinerant way of life. While we are presenting this work as a historical piece of American Musical Theater, we recognize and acknowledge that this is a dated term that negatively reflects the Romani people. Thank you for your support of Marblehead Little Theatre. We hope you enjoy this performance.

Ursina Amsler (Electra) is beyond thrilled to be back on stage after a more-than-two year Covid-induced hiatus. Recent pre-pandemic roles include the Witch in *Into the Woods* with Stage 284 and Tanya in MLT's *Mamma Mia!* which won 11 DASH awards, including Best Musical. Other regional stage credits include M'Lynn in *Steel Magnolias* (Theater Company of Saugus), Joanne in *Company* (Burlington Players), Lady Bracknell in *The Importance of Being Earnest* (MLT), and Fraulein Schneider in *Cabaret* (MLT). All-time favorite roles include Nancy in *Oliver!*, Mrs. Lyons in *Blood Brothers*, Nurse Ratched in *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* and Eliza Doolittle in *My Fair Lady*. Lola Bartlett (Youth Ensemble) is excited to be a part of the amazing cast of MLT's production of *Gypsy*.
